A Healthy and Beautiful Detroit, Built on Inclusionary Growth, Economic Opportunity, and an atmosphere of Trust.



Pumping Station Improvements

Freud & Conner Creek Pumping
Stations were temporarily restored
while long-term rehab is underway,
24/7 staffing is in effect.
Permanent improvements planned.
System-wide master planning efforts.


