Now happening:


- New cricket field at Lasky Park







What we've heard from you:

- Improve walking routes to parks, schools, businesses, and bus stops.
- Add wayfinding to help people find local gems, like Lasky Rec Center or the library.
- Conant and Campau are hard to cross, and hard to walk along.
- Improve safety and curb-appeal along shopping streets, to make customers feel comfortable.
- Take care of the basics: fix up broken streets and sidewalks












Vacant land owned by DLBA is shown in green Let's put this land to good use!

- Create more housing options for current residents.
- Interest in converting vacant houses into art and community spaces.
- Need more support in navigating the permit and enforcement process.
- Provide more support and infrastructure to help businesses grow and become profitable
- Encourage a wider mix of businesses on Conant.
