



FBI: Detroit's 2013 homicide rate leads the nation

Detroit had the highest homicide rate among the nation's larger cities in 2013, FBI crime statistics released today show.

According to the FBI, Detroit had 316 homicides in 2013 and a population of 699,889, putting the city's rate at about 45 homicides per 100,000 residents more than any other city in the nation with 100,000 or more residents.

The Detroit Police Department, though, reported the city actually had 333 criminal homicides in 2013 and,

according to the U.S. Census Bureau, the city's population was 688,701. Using those figures, the rate for 2013 would be roughly 48 homicides per 100,000.

According to the FBI homicide statistics, Detroit was followed by:

■New Orleans, La., which had a rate of about 41 homicides per 100,000 residents

Duggan to Detroiters: 'Give us 6 months' for upgrades



Mayor Mike Duggan, sworn in by Keith on Tuesday, says: "Give us six months to prove that we can turn things around."

Mayor Mike Duggan urged Detroiters considering moving out of the city to hold off for six months to give him, his administration and the new City Council the chance to show measurable improvements in the quality of life.

"Maybe your neighborhood's run down, you're in a house and you're thinking you're going to just walk away from it, it's a lost cause, like so many before you have," Duggan told a crowd of city, county and state leaders and others gathered Tuesday for an investiture ceremony for him, the council and the city's Police Commission.

"I say to you one thing: Just give us six months. Give us six months to prove that we can turn things around. Just push the pause button and don't leave that house yet. ... Give us six months before you walk away from the value of that house. Give us six months and let us prove to you what we can do."

LOWERING THE VIOLENCE RATE: PROJECT CEASEFIRE


In 2016, Project Ceasefire ramped up in Precincts 5 and 9 on the East Side.

- 1) Special dedicated unit of additional 10-12 investigators and enforcement officers working only on gun offenses.
- 2) "Group responsibility" When a group is involved in a shooting, police enforcement is directed at everyone associated with that group.
- 3) Coordinated law enforcement across agencies.
 - US Attorney takes gun cases federal where they get more time
 - Wayne County Prosecutor dedicates special gun enforcement prosecutors.
 - 5 Federal Agencies, 2 State Agencies, County Sheriff all coordinate response.
- 4) Quarterly call-ins of Parolees and Probationers for face-to-face meetings.
- 5) Job Training, Education, and other services offered to those at Call-Ins.




- 2,200 HUD supported low income housing units were scheduled to have their subsidies expire by 2019. We acted with three principles:
- 1) City would approve no more tax breaks for any development that displaces residents or reduces the number of affordable units.
- 2) Established affordable housing trust fund to support building owners who make a long-term commitment to subsidized units.
- 3) Met with every low income development owner to negotiate new 15-30 year commitments to keep subsidized housing.


Housing developers who receive a certain threshold of public subsidies or discounted city-owned land in Detroit will now be required to set aside at least 20% of their units for lower income residents, after the city council voted to approve two affordable housing ordinances Tuesday.

The two ordinances -- one requiring 20% affordable units and the other putting a notification ordinance in place to protect seniors and low income residents from being unexpectedly displaced -- were brought forth by Councilwoman Mary Sheffield, who said the vote was three years in the making, and an effort to push back against gentrification that's been seen elsewhere in the country.

"The gentrification that we see in New York, D.C., Chicago and Boston is not welcome







Detroit closed the books on fiscal 2017 with a \$53 million surplus, marking its third consecutive year of positive budget results since exiting Chapter 9, according to newly published audited results.

The surplus ticks another box off on the list of gains that must be accomplished to exit state oversight. Detroit must record three consecutive years of deficit-free budgets to win release from oversight by the Detroit Financial Review Commission under terms established as part of its exit from its historic Chapter 9 case in December 2014.




