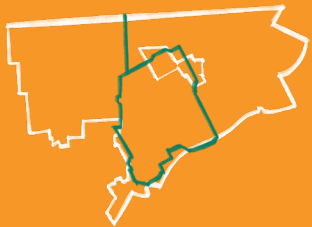


THE JOE LOUIS GREENWAY is a pathway that will unify Detroit's neighborhoods, people and parks.

We are listening to residents to understand how they want the greenway to influence their neighborhood. What do you want the greenway to do for you?

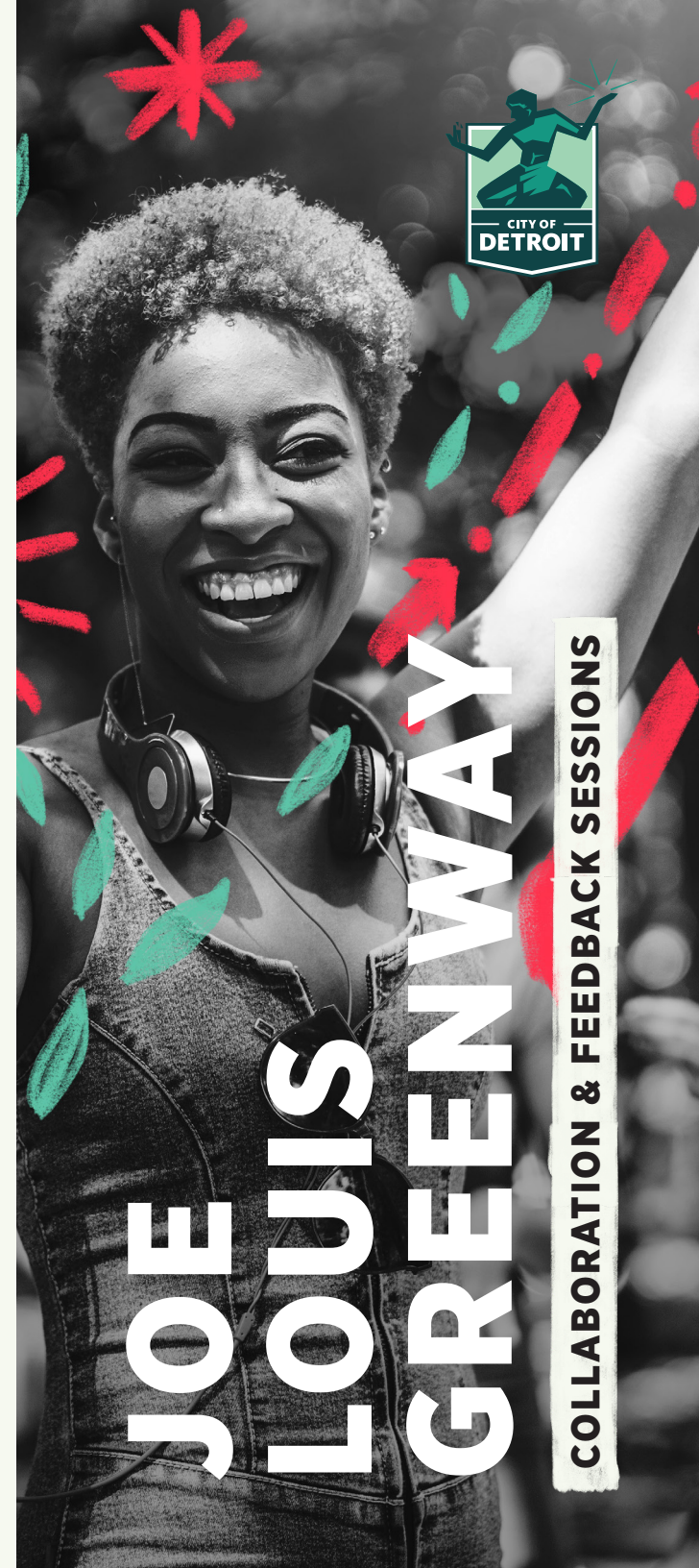


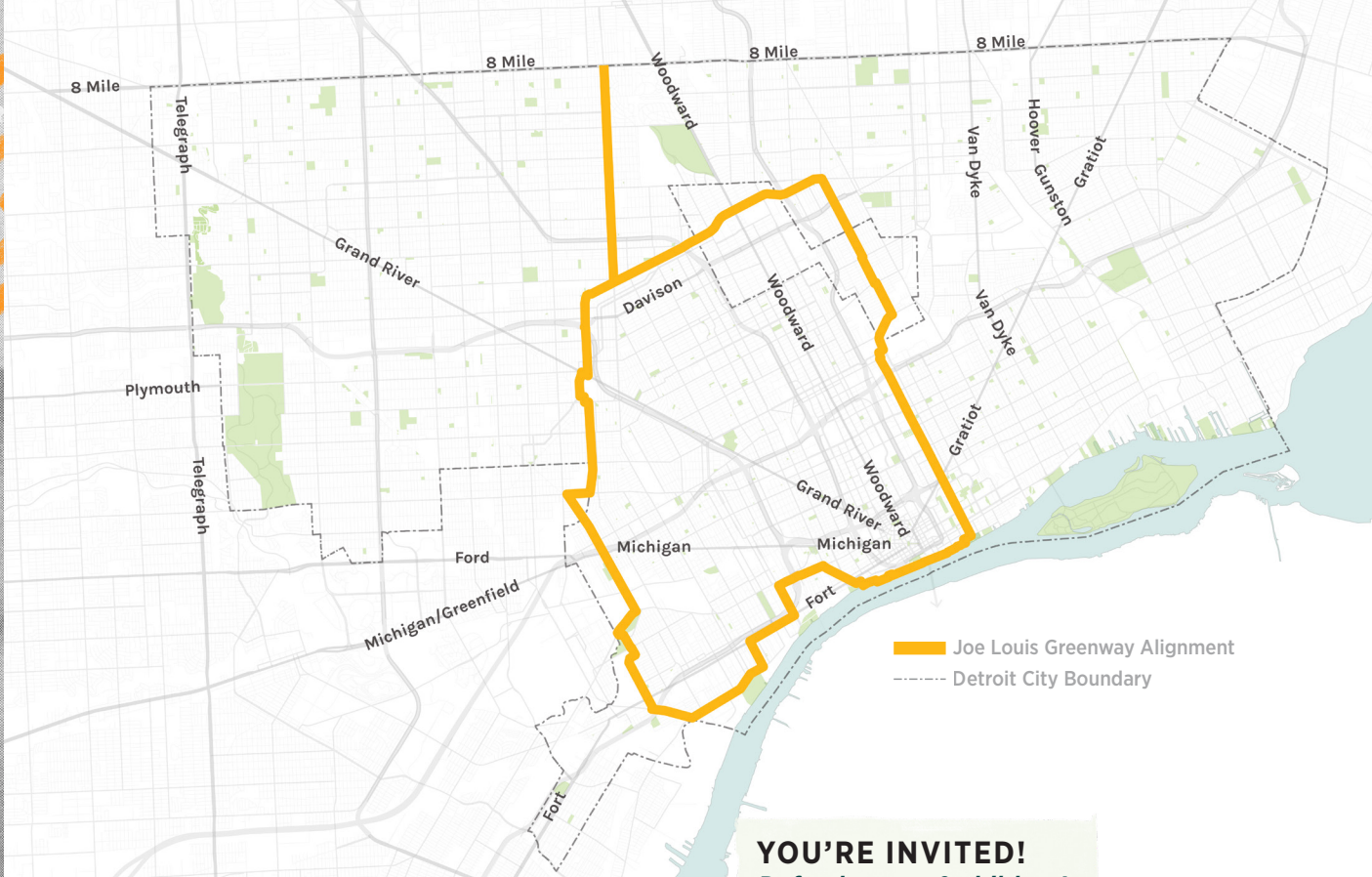
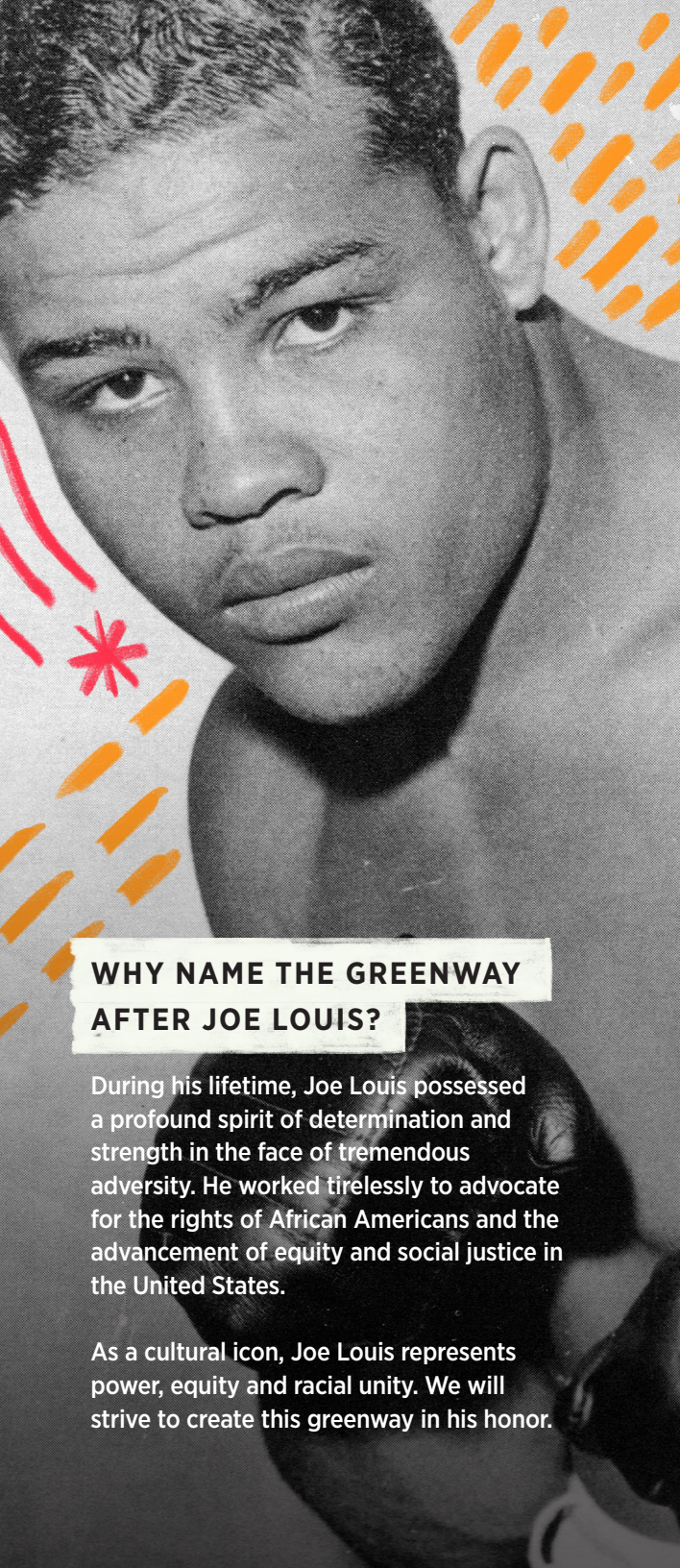
