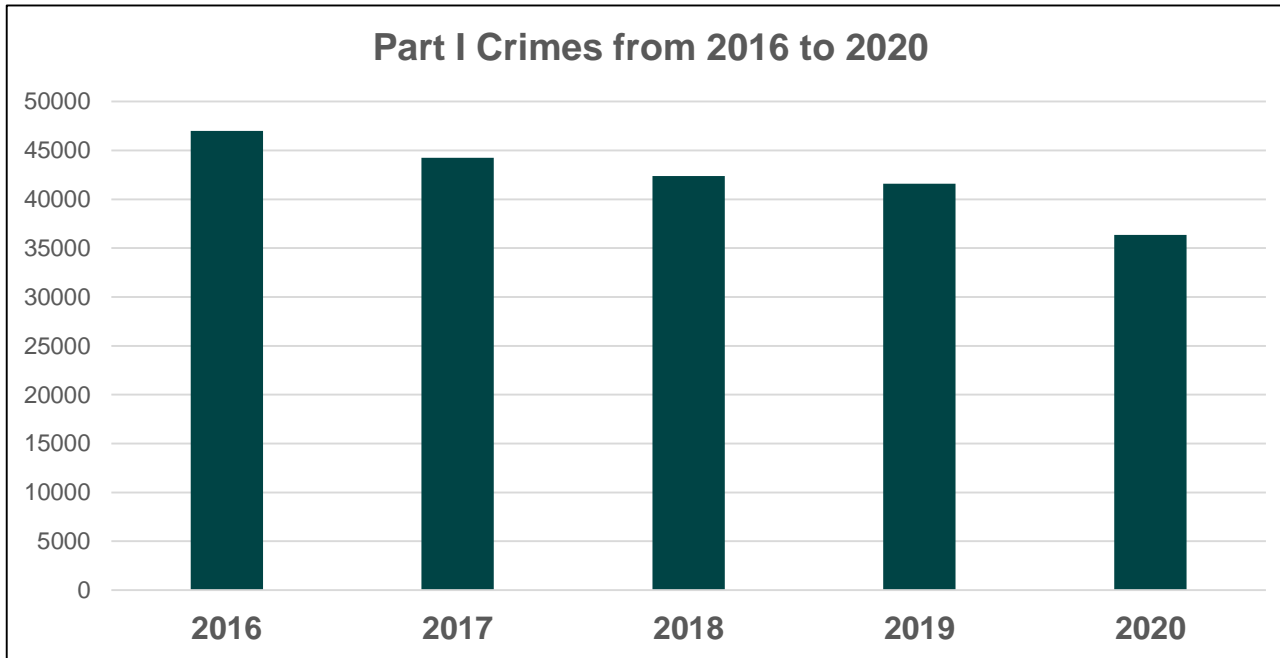

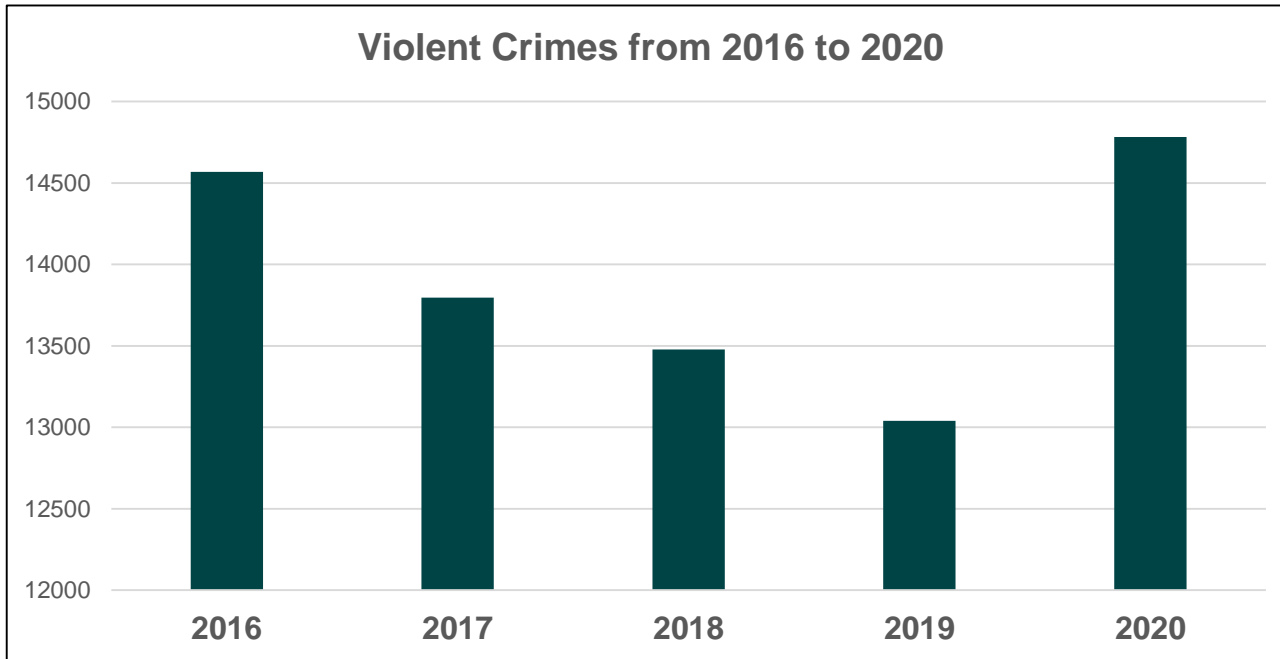

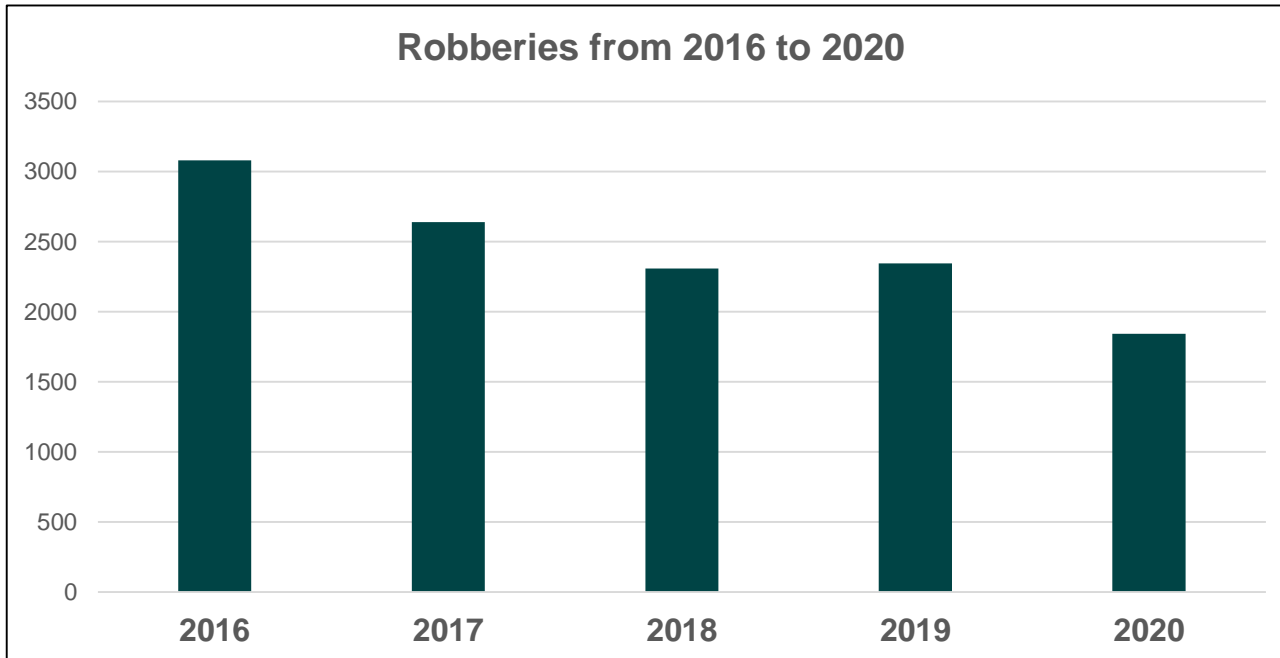
Detroit had 13% more Part 1 Violent Crimes compared to 2019

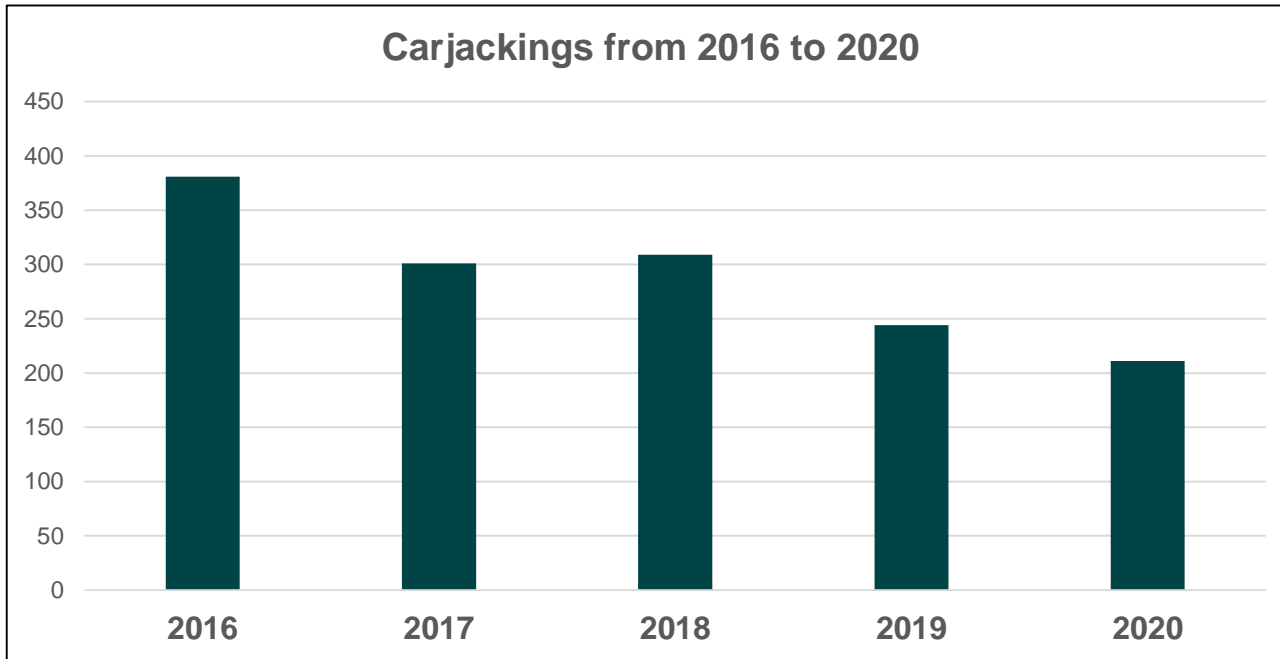

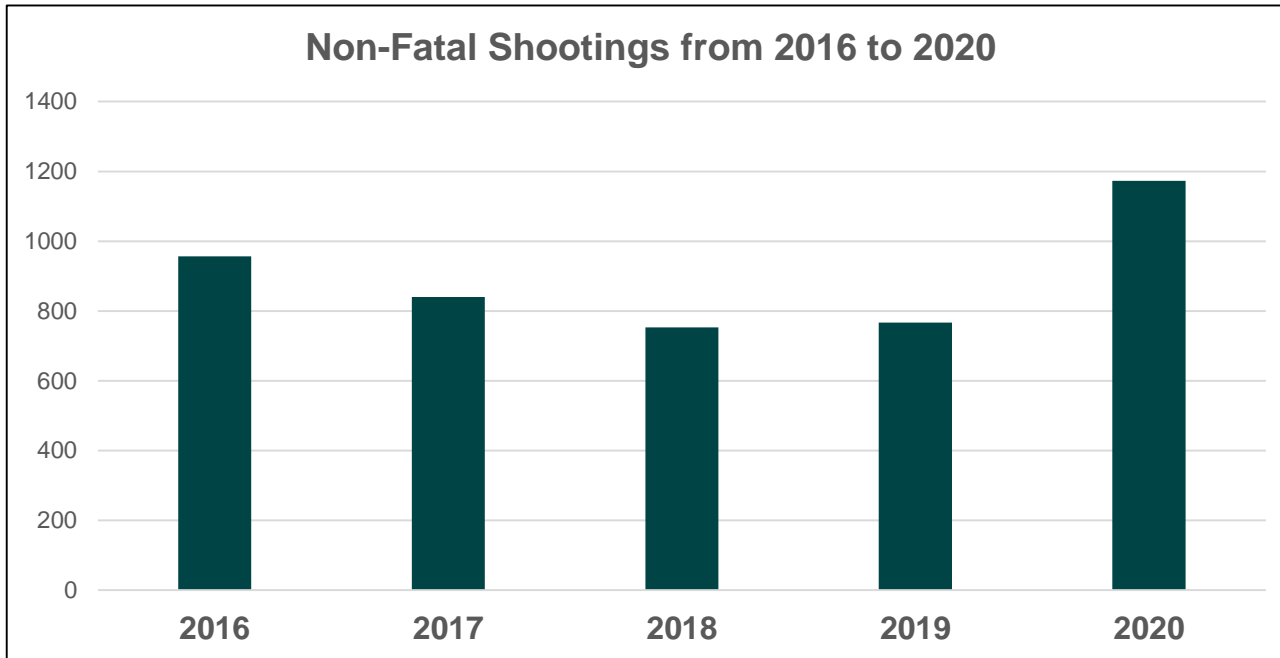

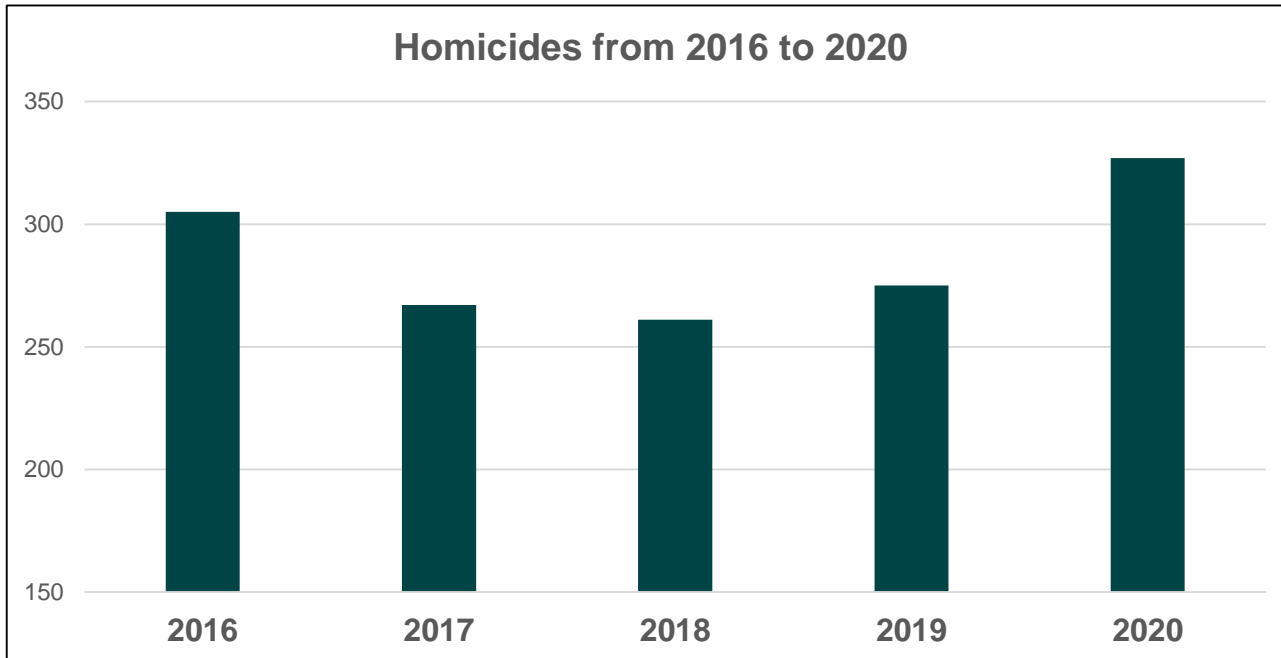

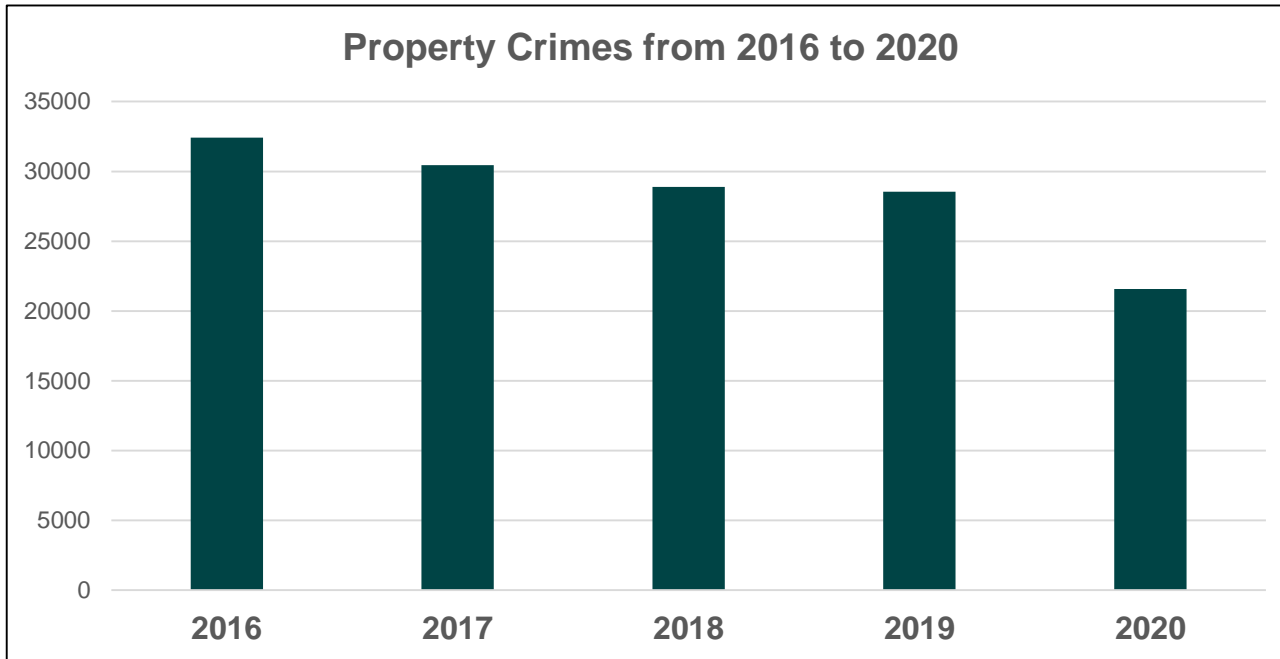

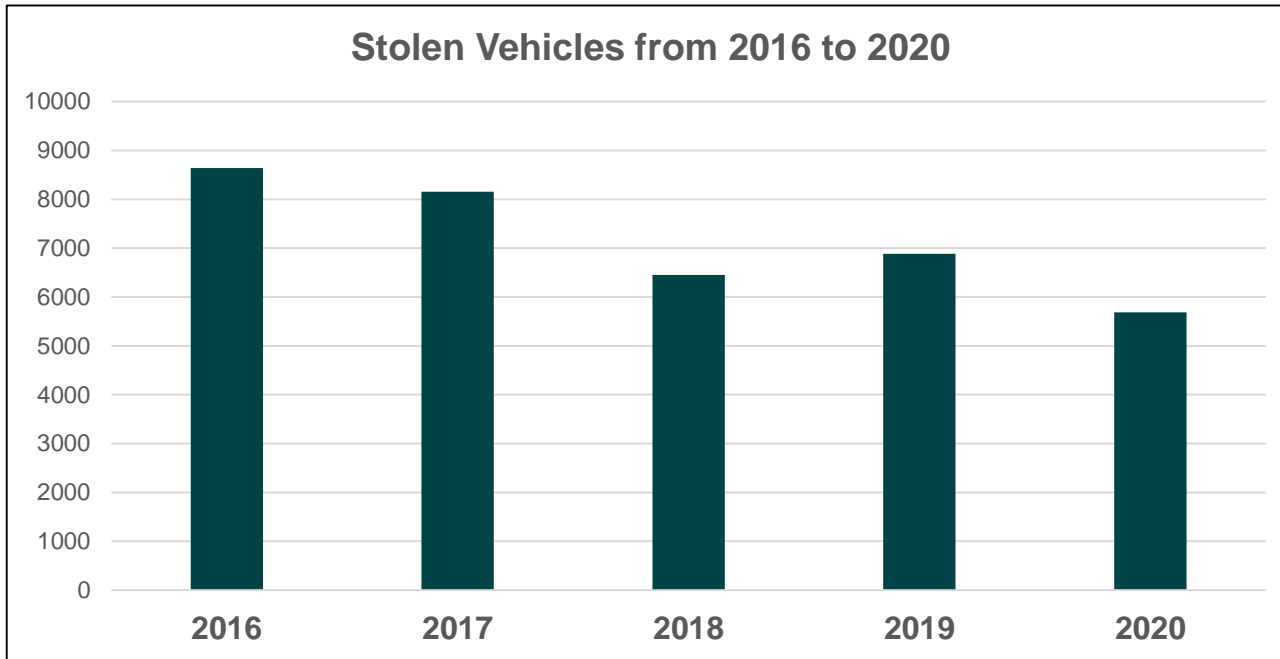
Detroit had 24% fewer Part 1 Property Crimes compared to 2019

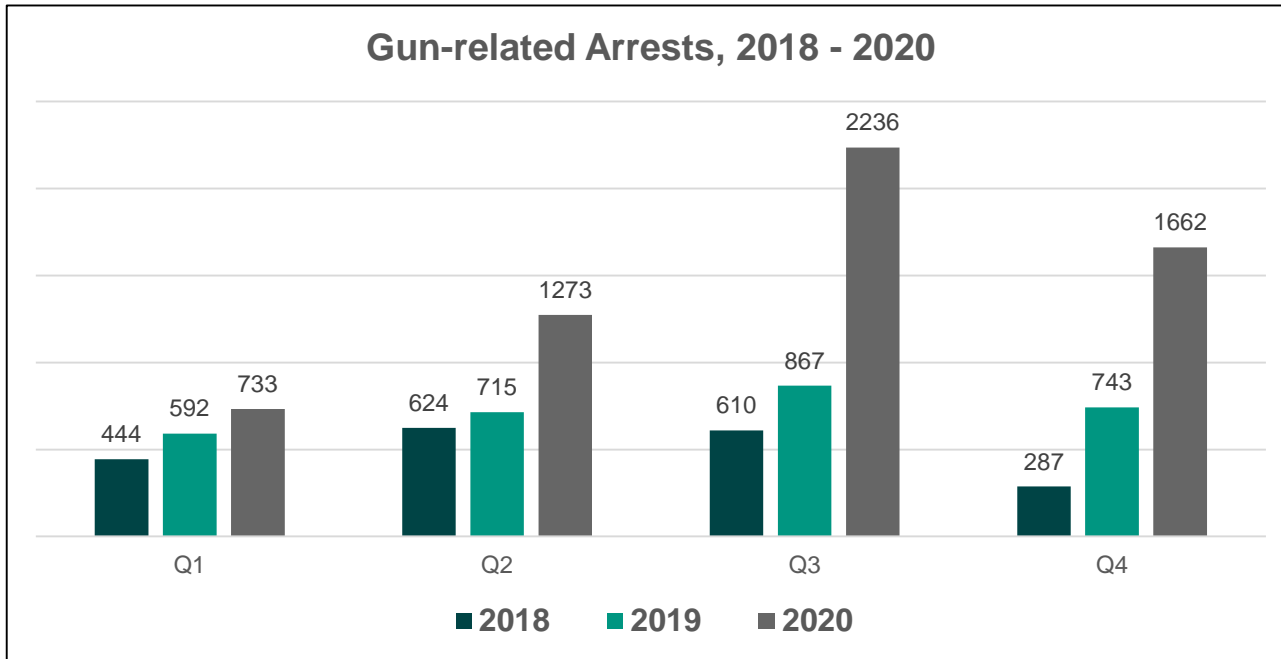

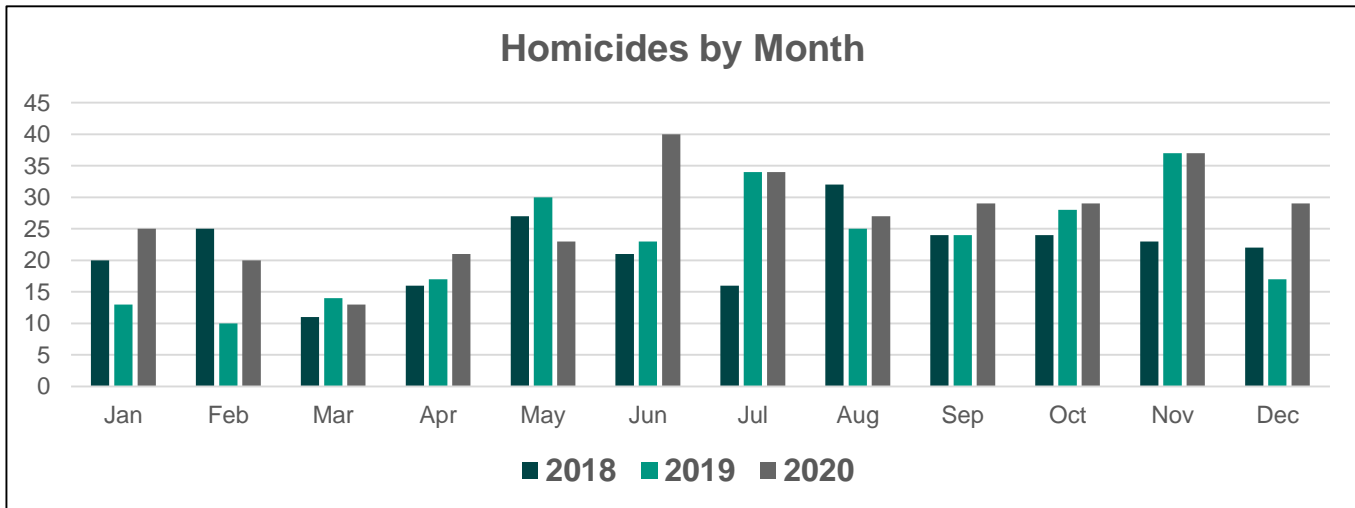
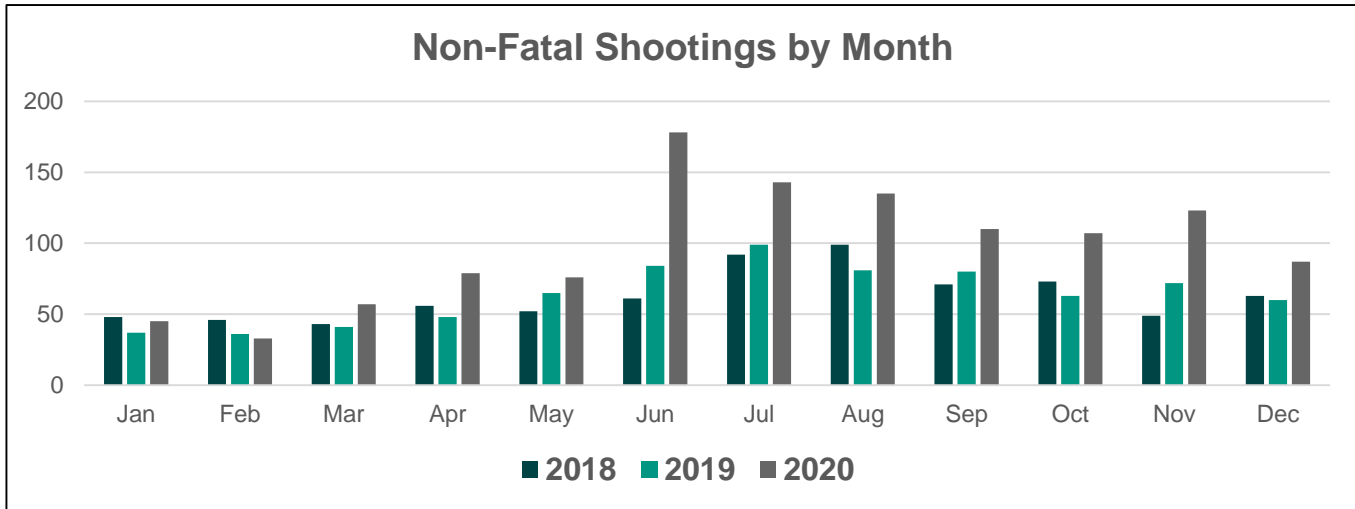
Gun-related arrests increased by 102% compared to 2019

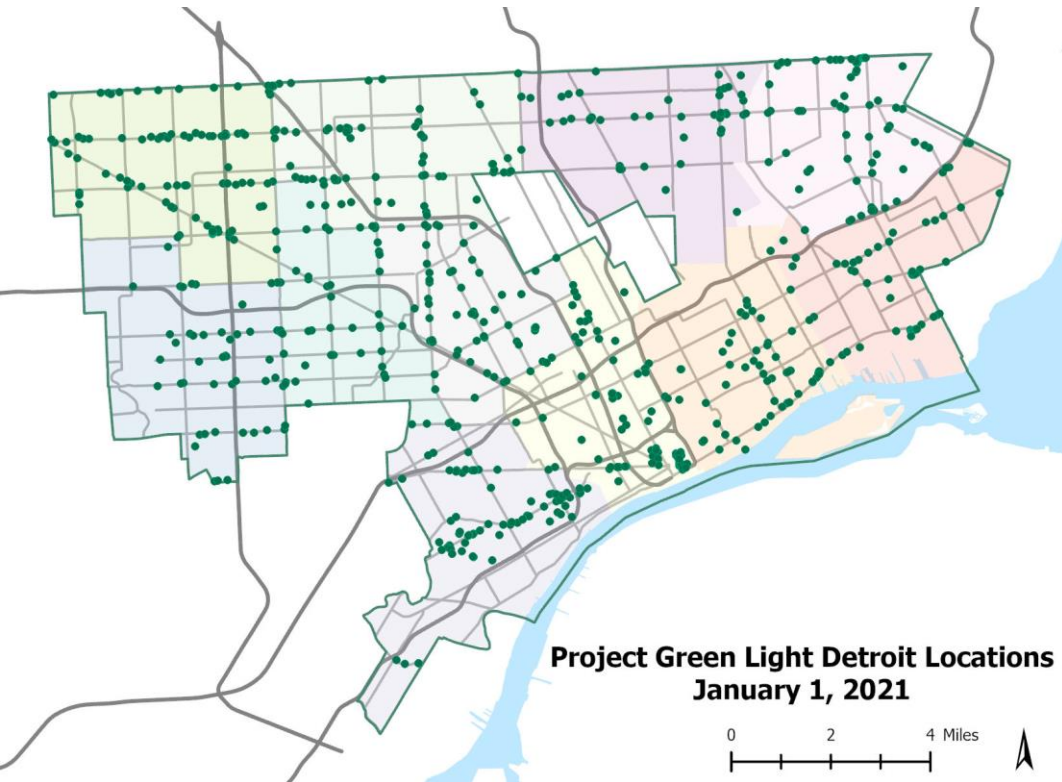


Comparison of NFS and Homicides by Month, 2018 - 2020

 - A **32% increase** compared to 2018

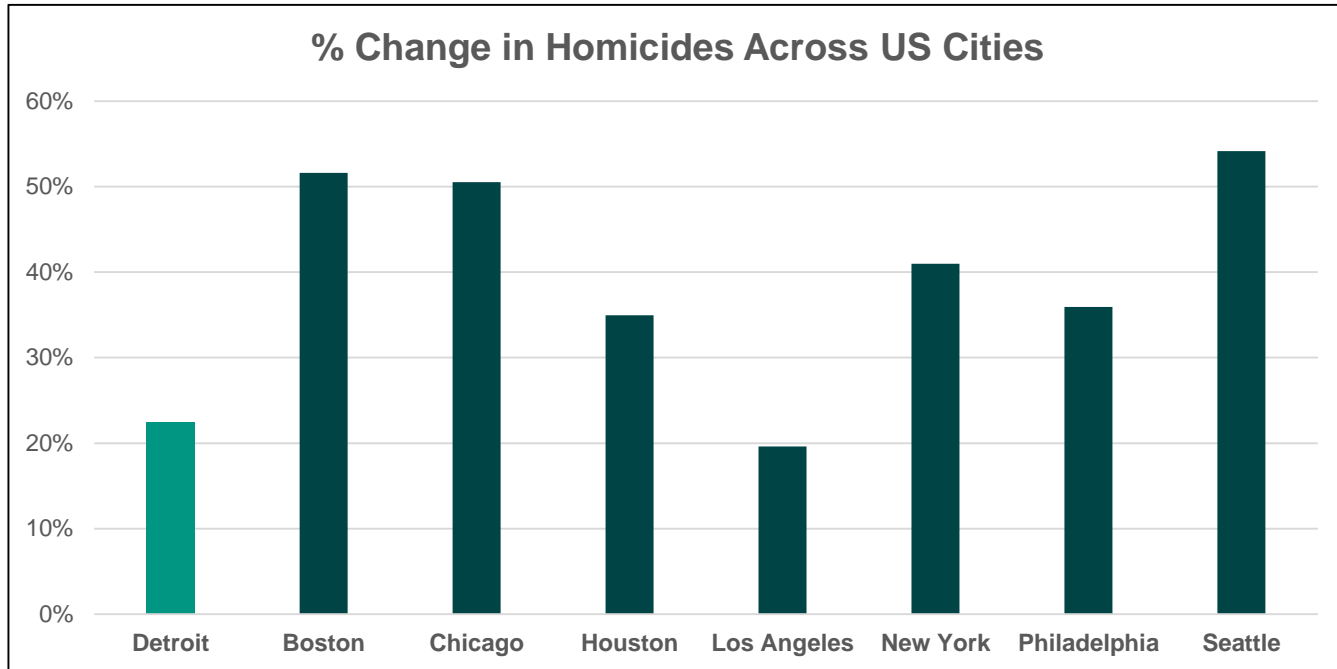

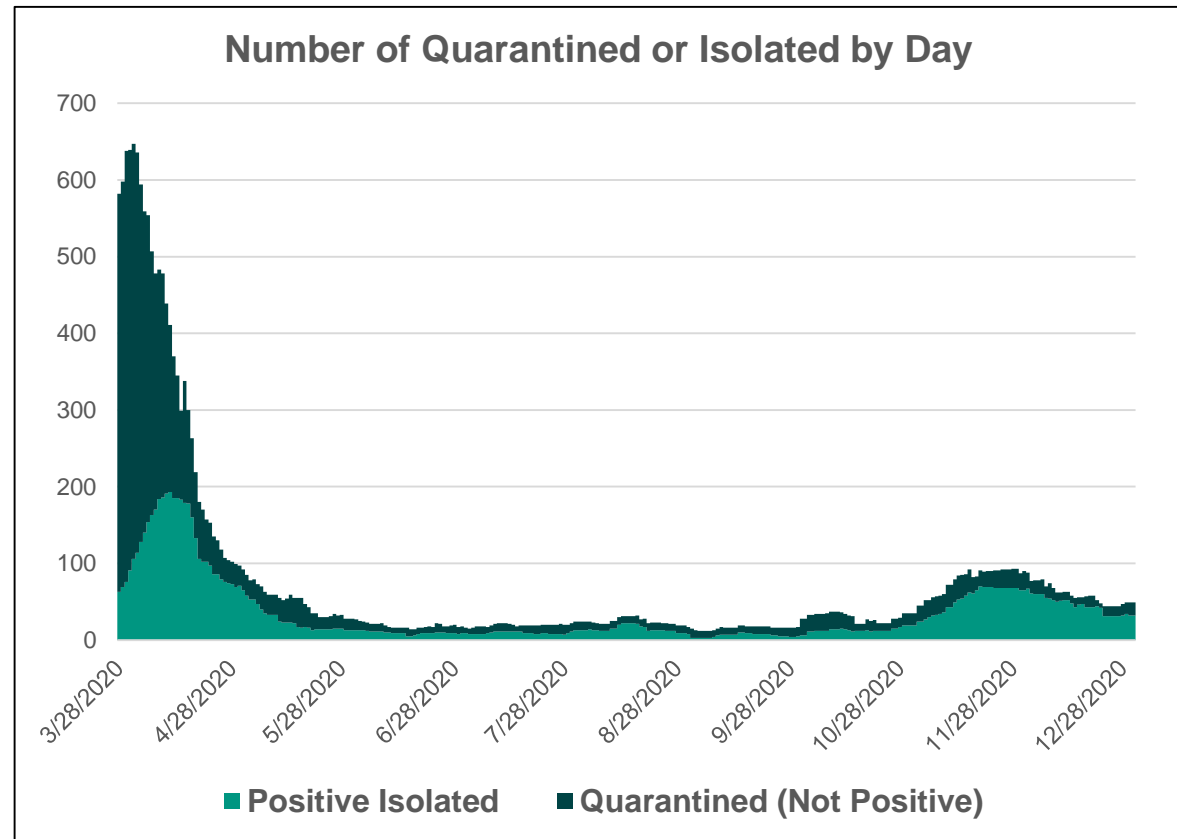

COVID-19 had a major impact on Department functions

COVID-19 Update

- **Over 500 members** have tested positive for COVID-19
- The Department has lost **~20,000 working days** due to quarantine
- **3 members** have **passed** due to complications stemming from COVID-19





DPD expended significant resources on protests

- **Police Reform:** Protests for police reform after the killing of Mr. George Floyd
 - Protested over 120 days since May 29th
 - Over 32,000 hours worked by DPD members*
- **Detroit Summer Schools:** Protests against beginning summer school during COVID-19
 - Protested for 8 days
 - Over 300 hours worked by DPD members*
- **Election Protests:** Protests against the Presidential Election results
 - Protested for 6 days
 - Over 1,200 hours worked by DPD members*

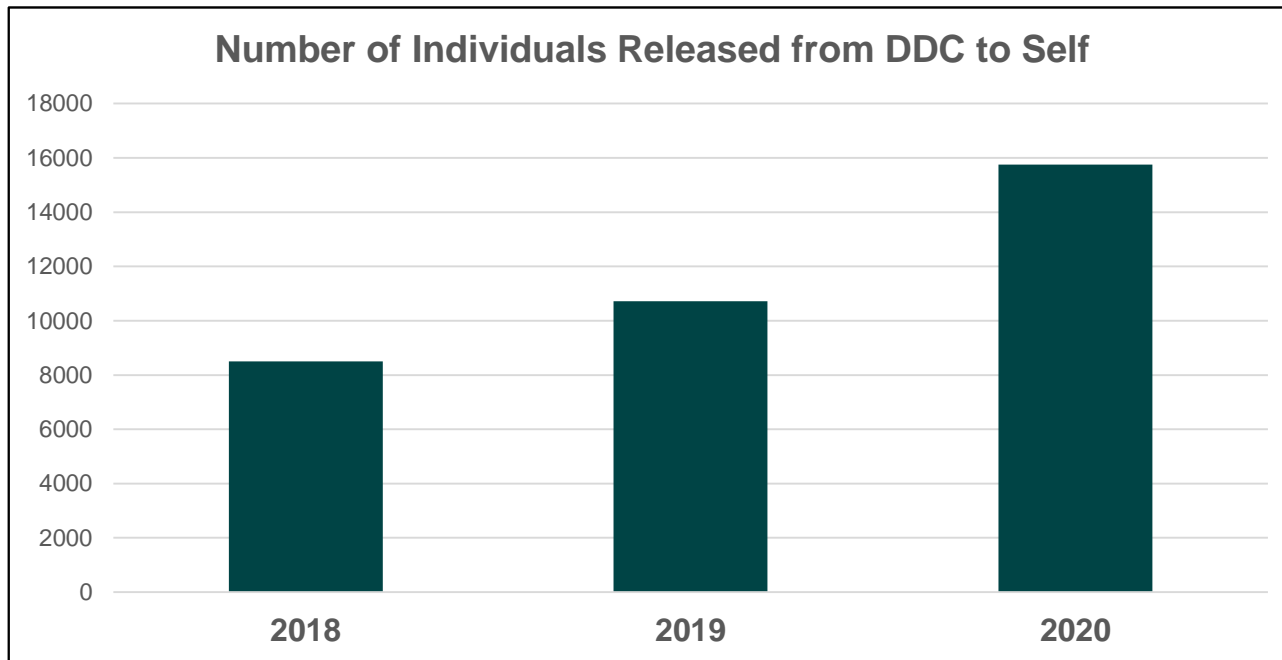
The protests resulted in:

- Over 30 members injured
- 7 DPD vehicles damaged with 3 taken out of service
- Over 500 arrests (~60% not Detroit Residents)

Compared to 2019, 47% more arrestees were released from the DDC without being transported to another agency

DPD, DWIHN, & HRD launched a 3-Pronged Intervention Mental Health Co-Response Pilot

Crisis Intervention Team Co-Response (DPD + DWIHN)

- A co-responding vehicle pairs a behavioral health specialist with mental health trained officers
- **Goal:** Reduce the use of emergency services for individuals experiencing a mental health crisis by providing linkages to services

911 Integrated Response (DPD 911 call center + DWIHN)

- Connect callers to behavioral health specialists embedded in 911 call center and address underlying needs
- **Goal:** Reduce 911 calls from high-utilizers in need of mental health services

Detroit Homeless Outreach Team (HRD + NPOs + DWIHN)

- Homelessness advocates and behavioral health workers connect homeless to services
- **Goal:** Prevent future emergency services by having homeless outreach providers and mental health case managers engage in street outreach

The **Office of Internal & External Relations** will lead DPD's effort to further bridge the gap between the community and the Police Department and improve mental health outcomes
