


Release A Contract Update

- The first \$30 million in demolition bid contracts have been awarded to 7 companies.
 - All 7 companies are small companies located in Detroit and each has hired a Detroit workforce of more than 50%.
 - City Council approved 12 of the contracts on 2/23/21. City Council approved the remaining 11 contracts on 3/2/21.


District 1 Release C Demolitions - 23 Total Homes



Preservation

<u>Vacant Property Unit (VPU):</u> is a new dedicated team responsible for preserving/securing homes to prevent additional blight within your neighborhoods. The Vacant Planning Unit is targeting one or more of the preservation efforts listed below to 6,000 homes using funding from Proposal N.

- <u>Trash Outs:</u> Vendors who will be responsible for removing trash and debris from vacant homes. Currently, the Demolition Department is procuring the trash out of 300 vacant homes.
- <u>Securing:</u> Is in house staff who will be responsible for securing openings to vacant homes.
- Roofing: Vendors will responsible for tarping or repairing roofs on vacant homes to prevent further deterioration.



Awarded Trash Out Contractors

- The first 23 Trash Out contracts have been awarded to 6 companies to remove debris from 300 properties.
 - All 23 contracts are going to Detroit Certified Small or Micro Businesses
 - 5 out of 6 are minority owned companies.


Abatement - What To Expect?

Prior to Knocking a home:

- Contractors are required to remove any accessible hazardous/regulated materials.
- Hazardous/regulated materials removed from the home are properly disposed in a Type II Landfill.
- Non-regulated waste removed from the home are placed behind the home, should not been seen from the street.
- Once property is demolished, all remaining debris will be removed from the property.



What Abatement Should Look Like?



- Material is removed from the building and placed in the backyard.
- At the end of each working day, the Contractor must ensure that the sidewalks, streets, alleyways, and surrounding properties are free of dust, debris, and other potential nuisances.
- Material should remain in the backyard until the home is knocked.
- Once the home is knocked, all debris is removed from the property.



What It Should Not Look Like



- Materials should not be scattered on the side or front of a home.
- Contractor may **not** park container(s) along the street in front of an occupied structure.
- If you notice materials being discarded in the front or side yard of a home within your neighborhood, please report it to the Detroit Demolition Department at **313-224-4737** or contact your District Manager.



Demolition Day - What To Expect?

<u>Process</u>: The "Wet/Wet/Wet" method was developed in Detroit. The Wet/Wet method is to keep dust down before, during and after demolition to protect residents and requires the following:

- 1. Pre-wetting: Knock holes in the roof and wet the interior of the attic space for 5 minutes then wet the entire exterior of the building.
- 2. Knockdown wetting: Wet the structure as it is being demolished.
- 3. Load-out wetting: Wet the debris as it is being loaded in the waste haulers.

Oversight: Demolition Department Field Liaisons on onsite for 90% + of the demolitions, ensuring the "Wet/Wet" method is followed. Each demolition produces a checklist, including a start and end time to ensure 5 minutes of pre-wetting takes place. Residents can approach Field Liaison's with any question or concerns they may have.

3 calendar days prior to demolition:

- Contractor must distribute City-provided public health and safety materials (door hangers) within 400 feet of the assigned site.
- Contractor must place 3 lawn signs on the property notifying the public of the demolition.



Following Demolition

- After a home has been demolished and backfilled, please refrain from accessing or using the side lot until it has been purchased from the Detroit Land Bank Authority.
- Parked vehicles, tree removal, and any other activities on the lot interfere with the City's ability to approve the final grade on the property.
- Final grade approval is required to transfer the lot back to the Detroit Lank Bank Authority for sale.

Proposal N

On the November 3rd ballot, Detroit residents approved Proposal N for Neighborhoods, a comprehensive plan to address 16,000 vacant houses in Detroit through rehabilitation or demolition. Proposal N allows the City of Detroit to sell \$250 million in Neighborhood Improvement Bonds.
