





COVENANT HEALTH CARE CENTER





Covenant Community Care has operated a federal health center at 18917 Joy Road since 2014

Our current clinic provides medical and behavioral health services to patients

A new clinic is coming!

We are building a larger clinic in the same neighborhood – less than one mile from our current site. This facility will add a full dental clinic – as well as expand the number of medical exam rooms to 11. Construction is slated to start later this summer.



Community outreach

- We have met with local groups such as the CRCAA Youth Council, Joy-Southfield CDC, schools, and churches to better understand the needs of those we serve.
- Our Joy clinic recently held a Superhero Outreach day to encourage children to receive check-ups that had been delayed due to Covid. This need was identified by one of our patients.







Car crashes into Detroit home, neighbors call for speed bumps







Detroit neighborhood pushes for speed bumps after 8-year-old girl killed by speeding driver

' It was a very sad moment,' Deshara Hill said



DETROIT - Residents in a neighborhood on Detroit's east side are demanding action.

The calls for action come just days after an 8-year-old girl was killed by a speeding car on **Conner Street**. Residents said they see drivers speeding down the street everyday and want the city to do something before another child is killed.



"When I come outside, the scene is just replaying, from when I came out and saw it actually happening," resident Deshara Hill said. "That's all I see when I come outside."

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
In 2018, we installed 32 speed humps as a pilot project






They were so popular we installed 543 in 2019






We more than doubled the number in 2020, installing 1,200







This year we are more than tripling to install 4,500 in 2021



2021 installation began April 1st - \$11M to install 4,500 speed humps along 3,200 blocks







We are only installing speed humps on blocks that have been requested by residents

Cut-Through	Parallel residential streets within 600 ft. of a commercial corridor (ex. Warrington/ Livernois or Albion/ Hoover)	
Near a Park and/or School	Streets within a .5 mile radius of a park or school as a traffic generator

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
What is a 'slow street'?

A slow street is a residential street with some form of traffic calming, such as speed cushions and signage.




Progress on creating 'slow streets'

In an effort to make Detroit's residential streets safer the City of Detroit will have installed over 6,000 speed cushions by the end of 2021.



What is a 'slow street network'?

The City wants to go a step further and connect these slower, residential streets to create a network of safe streets for walking, biking, and getting around your neighborhood. These will connect residents to parks, schools, rec. centers, shops, and more.



What Is Streets For People?

The City of Detroit is developing Streets for People, a transportation plan **to make it easier and safer for all Detroiters to move around the city.**

Working closely with you, we will create the **SFP Plan** and **SFP Design Guide** to guide how the City will invest in and design our streets and sidewalks over the next 10 years.





Values

Streets for People is rooted in five values:



1. SAFETY FIRST

Streets should be safe for all Detroiters - no more crashes, no more deaths.

2. EQUITY, DIGNITY, AND TRANSPARENCY



Detroiters, these are YOUR streets help us make them work best for you.

3. ACCESS FOR ALL

All Detroiters should be able to easily move around the city, no matter their age or ability.



4. ECONOMIC OPPORTUNITY



Improve access to jobs and support neighborhoods by designing better streets and mobility options.



5. PUBLIC HEALTH







Two types of designs are allowed:





W. WARREN STREETSCAPE

DPW leads design process beginning Q2 2021 and will lead streetscape construction during Q2 2022.

ECONOMIC DEVELOPMENT

PDD will issue RFP for facade renovation on W. Warren thru local CDC in Fall 2021. PDD & Dept. Arts, Culture, & Economy will collaborate Murals & blight remediation on W. Warren in Fall 2021.

PARKS & OPEN SPACE

GSD & PDD will lead engagement for TIreman Minock Park. GSD will lead design process for Simanek Park in Spring 2022. Stein Park Stage to be developed with youth by Fall 2021.

HOUSING

HRD will rehab homes and, DLBA will continue to market homes through Auction/Own It now in 3 focus areas. Bridging Neighborhoods will relocate approx 10 families to homes into rehabbed land bank homes


OTHER PROJECTS
