








CIVIC CENTER PUBLIC INPUT: WHAT WE HEARD FROM YOU

💛 What do you love about this place?


- The fountain (but turn it back on!)

🐑 What could be better?

- The **walking surface**, pavers are degraded and unsafe.
- **Create more green spaces**, and maintain the existing ones better.
- Position the monuments in a "more intentional" way.
- Love the festivals, but **activate/beautify** for everyday use.
- · Better bathroom facilities.
- · Safer crossing from Spirit Plaza.
- Boaters listen from the water but have **no docking access.**
- **More parking** is needed for people working the events.











CIVIC CENTER EXPANDED RIVERWALK







HART PLAZA DRAFT RECOMMENDATIONS

- Restore many of the historic features of the plaza such as the amphitheater, pyramid stage, and Dodge Fountain
- Limit public access to the underground infrastructure and simplify the layout
- Create a utility corridor that allows for safe and efficient truck access and new power and water at both levels
- Revise stair access to the Riverwalk
- Introduce more green landscaping
- Plan for a new comfort station/concession building that can be accessed by all park users



SPIRIT PLAZA + THE FIST DRAFT RECOMMENDATIONS

SPIRIT PLAZA

- Continue to monitor and adjust programming based on user needs
- Consider re-designing the plaza after Hart Plaza is fully renovated and activated

JOE LOUIS FIST

- Introduce landscaping surrounding the monument while allowing limited pedestrian access
- Provide special paving in the Jefferson ROW that connects Woodward Ave. to Hart Plaza


