




Dog Bite Calls



Goal: 50% decrease in bites by Dec. 31, 2021

In 2021 we averaged 49 reported bites per month which is a 33% increase over 2020. In 2022, we are averaging 37 bites per month which is a decrease of 24%. March 2022 there were 44 bites reported versus 72 bites reported in March 2021, This is a 38% decrease in 2022.

Note: These are unconfirmed bite counts from the animal database, not the confirmed Health Department data.

WHAT TO DO IF YOU SEE A LOOSE DOG?





WHAT TO DO IF YOU SEE A LOOSE DOG?

- Obtain the address, intersection, and/or area where you saw the dog. Be prepared to report breed, condition of dog, and if anyone was injured or bit.
- Call 313-922-DOGS (3647).
- Speak to an operator and make your report.



HOW TO REDUCE THE NUMBER OF LOOSE DOGS IN DETROIT

- Spay and Neuter Stops urine marking, stops urge to roam, stops excessive barking and mounting.
- <u>Tethering</u>- Keep your animal on your property to reduce the risk of bites, dog fights and the forever loss of your dog. Do not tether the dog for over a 3-hour period. Use a vinyl coated steel cable tether.
- <u>Duty of Care</u>- Supply your dog with the proper shelter, food and water, tethering and enrichment activities (like walking) it will reduce the urge to roam.
- Microchips Chips help us to return the dog to its owner.
- Rabies & Licensing- Rabies vaccinations and licenses are required by law and keep the public safe. Tag numbers help us identify the owner.

WHAT HAPPENS WHEN STRAY CATS ARE FED?

Habitat and food sources

- 1. Stray cats are equipped to find and catch their own food.
- 2. Stray cats will stay in the area if they are being fed.

When stray cats are fed they:

- Stop hunting rodents
- 2. Procreate
- 3. Increase likelihood of nuisance (<u>waste, gardens and plants</u> <u>disturbed, cats on adjacent properties</u>)

Animal Control Officers are writing tickets to violators of the city ordinance, but over 50% of those citizens ticketed fail to appear in court. The subsequent bench warrant is ineffective; it does absolutely nothing for the animals, especially for cases in which the owner cited for the was Failure to Provide Food, Water and/or Adequate Shelter. Dogs will continue to suffer and possibly die while waiting for the owner to get arrested for the bench warrant.




