- Recorded proof of ownership
- Current photo ID for ALL ADULTS in the home
- Proof of residency for ALL MINORS in the home
- Proof of income for ALL ADULTS AND MINORS in the home (e.g. for minors - FIA statement, report card, transcript, minor listed on tax return, etc.)
- 2021 Federal and State tax returns for ALL ADULTS REQUIRED TO FILE
