
With several bike stations across Detroit, this is a fun, healthy and easy way to get around.

#### **Relocation: The GIN Notice**

The General Information Notice **(GIN)** was the first notice that Clement Kern Gardens received with details regarding relocation. This notice was distributed by Clement Kern Gardens management company, Independent Management Services (IMS). If you have not signed the GIN yet, please contact the front office. Starting early next year IMS will begin contacting residents to get their housing preferences for relocation. These preferences will inform the content of the Notice of Relocation Eligibility **(NOE)** that will be sent out in accordance with the schedule to the right, 8 months prior to each phase's demolition.

#### **June 23rd Resident Council Meeting Highlights**

Ted Phillips, UCHC's Executive Director, introduced his work and Detroit's housing rights movement. Phillips stressed the importance of avoiding eviction and the urgency of applying for CERA if back rent is owed. Common scenarios that could cause a tenant to be non-first phase should break ground in the spring. 30 of the compliant with their lease and risk eviction were reviewed as well as how to seek help when facing such circumstances.

Meg Marotte and Kiana Jackson, Tenant Organizers for UCHC, suggested topics, guest speakers, and event ideas for future meetings to get feedback on the council's interests.

Armeace Williams, TCB Development Project Manager, presented images of the Preserve on Ash complex being developed in North Corktown. This "garden style" development will be constructed in two phases. The units will be sold to qualified buyers. The homeownership process was discussed.

Meg presented the HUD Guidelines to the tenant council members, stressing the importance of their right to be an independent group and to dictate who is invited to council meetings.







#### **Response to Questions Raised on 5/23/22**

During the May 23rd resident council meeting, a number of questions came up about the future design of Clement *Kern Gardens + conditions at the property today. Property* owner and developer ACD provided the following responses:

Q: How will rent be calculated once CKG residents are relocated?

A: It will be calculated as it is currently.

Q: What types and styles of units will be constructed at Left Field and the redeveloped CKG?

A: Townhomes, Midrises, and Walkups.

Q: Will each unit have a screened door?

A: This is not yet known.

Q: Will residents be able to pick out the materials/ finishes within the new units? A: No.

Q: What considerations are being made for the needs of seniors?

A: An elevator building is being constructed & 10% of new units will be Americans with Disabilities Act (ADA) accessible.

Q: What infractions might prevent a resident from being able to return to CKG?

A: If the resident is eligible to live at CKG now, they will be eligible to return. Criteria for eligibility remains the same.

Q: What is being done to address concerns around garbage, rodents, and pests today at CKG?

A: Residents should be able to talk with IMS about this.

Q: Can a map be provided outlining where the different housing options will be located?
