Relocation: The GIN Notice



The General Information Notice (GIN) will be the first notice that Clement Kern Gardens will receive in terms of what to expect regarding relocation. The Notice of Eligibility for Relocation Assistance (NOE) will accompany the GIN and that notice will advise residents on their eligibility to receive location assistance. These notices will be distributed by Clement Kern Gardens management company, Independent Management Services (IMS). They will also be responsible for collecting signatures/ receipts from residents that receive these notices.











Understanding the General Information Notice



Regulations: There are two forces that guide the rules for the relocation activities at Clement Kern Gardens: The Uniform Relocation and Real Property Acquisition Act **(URA)** and the Choice Neighborhoods Implementation Grant **(CNI)**. Both require that the City of Detroit and the Property Owner - American Community Developers (ACD) provide you with the General Information Notice (GIN) to explain to you your rights and the conditions of maintaining those rights under the **URA** and **CNI**.

Rights Under the URA:

Upon having to relocate from Clement Kern Gardens, the **URA** guarantees you:

- Replacement housing and advisory services: we will find you a new place to live where you can afford rent.
- Moving expenses paid: we will pay to move you to your new housing including all personal property.
- **Replacement housing payments**: If we cannot find you another comparable place to live that you can afford, we will give you enough to cover the difference for up to 42 months.
- Notice of when you have to move: we will give you at least 90 days notice of where you will move to and the date of the move.

How to Keep these Rights:

The **URA** guarantees the rights to the left, so long as you:

- Do not get evicted
- Continue to pay rent
- Stay in your current unit until you receive a Notice of Relocation Eligibility (NOE)

*Please note: The URA does not cover anyone who is present in the US illegally. The City and ACD is committed to making sure everyone has a place to move to during construction regardless of citizenship status.

Rights Under CNI:

The CNI grant says the City must follow the rules of the URA with an extra rule specific to CNI:

Everyone currently living at Clement Kern Gardens has the <u>right to return</u> to the redeveloped Clement Kern Gardens.

So long as you are not evicted from the replacement unit, continue to pay rent at the replacement unit, and remain at Clement Kern Gardens until you receive a formal Notice of Relocation Eligibility (NOE), you will have the right to return to the new development and will have first right to the new units.


- Clement Kern Gardens East: 1511- Early 2023 1527 & 1531-1667
- Clement Kern Gardens Central: 1571- Early 2025 1589, 1611-1619, 1645-1659,1611-1, 1655-1679, & 1681-1695
- Clement Kern Gardens West: 1701-1727, 1731-1767, 1771-1781, & 1783-1795

So now what?

- **DON'T MOVE:** wait for the NOE
- KEEP PAYING RENT

Phase I: Left Field

Ownership **Phase IIB: North Corktown Home**

West of Wabash St along Ash St. Directly East of Preserve on Ash I &II,

Located on Bagley St, between Rosa **Phase III: Clement Kern Gardens**

Parks Blvd and Trumbull Ave

Phase IV: Ford PAL Sites

Phase V: Bagley Homeownership

Wabash St, about two blocks West of Northwest corner of Bagley St and Clement Kern Gardens
