
- The 2023 report verifies Detroit's drinking water continues to meet or exceed state and federal regulations

Since 2016, rate increases average 2.9%





Detroit's residential water bill in comparison with other large cities







Lifeline Plan helping more than 30,500 households with lower bills, access to water



DWSD Lifeline Plan

- Detroit's income-based water affordability program
- Past due balance erased upon enrollment
- Water shutoff protection
- Affordable fixed bill based on household income and size, and up to 1,125 gallons of indoor water usage per household member per month
- Minor plumbing repairs for high water usage

New DWSD payment plan as easy as \$10 down



DWSD EasyPay \$10 Down Plan

Developed for Detroit residents, non-profits, faith-based organizations and businesses that experience difficulty in paying past due balances for water, sewerage and drainage charges.

- Replaces the 10/30/50 Plan
- Low down payment \$10 <u>deposit</u>, no matter balance
- No income restrictions to qualify
- No barriers to enter
- All types of customers qualify



Making it easy to understand and enroll



- Any customer with a past due balance may enroll with \$10 down
- Remaining balance will be spread across 36 months
- Interest FREE
- Water shutoff protection as long as current
- If you income qualify for the Lifeline Plan, this plan is not for you




What does EasyPay look like to the average residential customer?



The customer makes a \$10.00 down payment. The past due balance is divided across 36-months, plus the current monthly water, sewer and drainage bill.







Cardiac

Heart attack is a circulation problem. Blood flow to the heart is blocked.

Arrest vs

Cardiac arrest is an electrical problem. The heart malfunctions and suddenly stops beating.

Heart

A heart attack may CAUSE cardiac arrest

90% of out-of-hospital cardiac

arrest victims will die

National bystander CPR rate is less than 40%

70% of cardiac arrests occur in the

Minutes count—immediate CPR is crucial to cardiac arrest survival

STOP LIFESAVERS CDR

What is Hands-only CPR

Hands-Only CPR is CPR without mouth-to-mouth breaths.

By pushing hard and fast on someone's chest, you are:

- Performing chest compressions which act like an external heart
- Helping to pump blood to the vital organs such as the brain





First Steps

- Check the scene
- Tap & shout
- Phone 9-1-1 and get an AED
- Check for breathing





Compressions

- Push hard & fast
- Depth of at least 2 inches
 - Rate of 100-120 compressions
- per minute






AED -

Automated External Defibrillator

- Use AED as soon as it arrives
- Turn on the AED and follow
- directions

Immediately resume CPR after shock





Putting it all together

- Scene Assessment
- Begin Compressions
- AED arrives
 Turn on the AED and follow directions
 - Resume compressions





REVIEW

- After calling 9-1-1, stay on the phone until the dispatcher provides further instructions
- As a bystander, don't be afraid
- Your actions can only help



Push hard and fast

- Push hard and fast in the center of the chest
- At least 2 inches deep
- Rate of 100 -120 bpm
- Use an AED as soon as it arrives. Turn it on and follow the directions.



Adults and teens only

- Hands-Only CPR is only for Adults and Teens.
- Infants and children need breaths.
- •Minutes count perform Hands Only CPR immediately.

If you see a teen or adult suddenly collapse, start the chain of survival! Call 911

Start Hands-Only CPR (chest compressions)

Use an AED as soon as one is available


Socioeconomic Factors

- Poverty
- Low employment rates
- Lack of health insurance coverage
- Barriers to Care
 - Inconsistent management
 - Increased ER visits and/or hospitalizations
 - Advanced disease results in harder to treat asthma



Asthma: Symptoms of Adults and Adolescents


- Cough (at night or early morning)
- Wheeze
- Shortness of Breath
- Chest Tightness





Asthma: Symptoms of Children (< 5 years old)

- Cough, wheeze, heavy breathing for > 10 days during virus
- > 3 episodes/year or severe episodes
- Between episodes, cough, wheeze or heavy breathing during play or when laughing

- Clinical History
- Pulmonary Function Test
 - -Hospital based
- Spirometry
 - -Office based
