

Detroit Health Department Business Guidance - Halloween 2020

The following guidelines are applicable to ALL Halloween activities and are based on information from the Centers for Disease Control and Prevention and include references to the Governor's executive orders. Where applicable, links to the full executive policy have been provided.

All Businesses

- Enforce use of proper CDC-recommended face covering for staff and patrons
- Promote social distancing
- Require at least 6ft. separation between parties of same household
 - Place tape or other indicators on the floor to remind patrons to socially distance, especially for patrons waiting in line
- Create a COVID-19 preparedness plan
 - Conduct and document health screening for employees and customers
- Make hand sanitizer available throughout facility
- Regularly clean and disinfect
 - High-touch surfaces
 - Door Handles
 - Tables/Chairs
 - Bathrooms
- Display multiple signage around building to promote wearing masks, social distancing, washing hands

Bars, Restaurants and Nightclubs

- Indoor service not allowed if alcohol sales are GREATER THAN 70% of gross profit
- Prohibit access to common areas where people can congregate, dance or otherwise mingle
 Place tables for food service in dance area
- Limit capacity to 50%
- Sell alcoholic beverages via table service only
 - Use prepackaged single service drinks and snacks
- All patrons to remain seated at table except when entering, leaving or going to the restroom

INDOOR

• **RESIDENTIAL VENUES**

• limit capacity to 10 people

• FIXED SEATING VENUES

o limit capacity to 20% of seating capacity, up to 500 people max

• VENUES WITHOUT FIXED SEATING

o limit capacity to 20 people per 1,000 sq./ft. of venue space, up to 500 people max

OUTDOOR

- **RESIDENTIAL VENUE**
 - May accommodate up to 100 people

• FIXED SEATING VENUE

• Can permit 30% of seating capacity, up to 1,000 people max

• VENUES WITHOUT FIXED SEATING

• May allow 30 people per 1,000 sq./ft., up to 1,000 people max

These guidelines are applicable to all Halloween activities and include specific references to the <u>Detroit Public Health Department</u> and CDC Guidelines for <u>BUSINESSES</u> and <u>EVENTS/GATHERINGS</u>.

Pursuant to MCL 333.2235(1), local health departments are authorized to carry out and enforce the terms of this order
